Stanley Richard Lount was born on 22nd June 1921, the son of Thomas William and Ethel Winnifred Lount of 23 Aston Lane, Aston Flamville, where his father was employed as a farm labourer. Stanley attended the National School in Burbage along with his older siblings Herbert William, Ethel May, Thomas Henry and Muriel Amy.

On leaving the National School, Stanley attended the Hinckley Grammar School from 1932 to 1937, and prior to joining the RAF was employed in the laboratory of Messrs. John Ellis and Sons of Stoney Stanton.

Stanley death is registered at Sleaford, where he was most likely to have been serving nearby at RAF Cranwell, he died on 17th February 1941 as a result of an illness.

He is laid to rest near his family home at St Peters Church, Aston Flamville.

Hinckley Times report 21st February 1941:

It is with regret that we record the death at an RAF Hospital on Monday of A/C Stanley Richard Lount, younger son of the late Mr T Lount of Aston Lane, Burbage.

The deceased who was 19 years of age was an Old Hinckleyan and had been in the RAF for the past nine months.

He was a keen sportsman and was well known in the Hinckley district for sporting activities. He played cricket for Hinckley Amateurs and also took part with great distinction in the games whilst at the Grammar School.

He was formerly employed by Messrs. John Ellis Ltd of Stoney Stanton.

The funeral takes place in the Aston Flamville churchyard this afternoon (Friday).

Stanley Lount died on February 17th 1941 as a result of an illness contracted whilst serving in the RAF. He had been in the RAF for nearly a year and had been most successful in his examinations and was popular with his fellow men. Before joining the RAF, he was employed in the Laboratory of Messrs. John Ellis and Sons, Stoney Stanton, where he distinguished himself by his sound and conscientious work. At school he took advantage of all that was offered, playing a good game of Rugby football, where he was noted for tackling and a sound game of cricket and he also helped to make the 1937 Camp at Salcombe a success.
